## TENSE CHANGE

When reporting someone's words we usually move one tense further into the <u>past.</u>

 $\begin{array}{ccc} \underline{\mathsf{takes}} & \to \mathsf{took} & \to \mathsf{had} \; \mathsf{taken} \\ \underline{\mathsf{is}} \; \mathsf{taking} & \to \mathsf{was} \; \mathsf{taking} & \to \mathsf{had} \; \mathsf{been} \; \mathsf{taking} \\ \underline{\mathsf{has/have}} \; \mathsf{taken} & \to \mathsf{had} \; \mathsf{taken} & \to \mathsf{X} \\ \underline{\mathsf{will}} \; \mathsf{take} & \to \mathsf{would} \; \mathsf{take} & \to \mathsf{X} \end{array}$ 

### TIME EXPRESSIONS

today → that day

yesterday → the day before / the previous day

tomorrow → the next day / the following day

tonight  $\rightarrow$  that night

now  $\rightarrow$  then

last week → the week before / the previous week

#### **OTHER CHANGES**

Some changes depend on the context of the sentence we are reporting. (\*)

this  $\rightarrow$  that these  $\rightarrow$  those here  $\rightarrow$  there

 $l \rightarrow he / she (*)$  we  $\rightarrow they (*)$  you  $\rightarrow me/us/her/him (*)$
