REPORTED SPEECH (INDIRECT SPEEC

When we quote someone's words, we can do by repeating the same words (direct speech) or by reporting the words spoken (indirect speech). We can report statements, questions, commands, etc. The most important aspects are the changes in verbs time, expressions of time and place, personal pronouns and possessive adjectives. Remember reported speech doesn't used quotation marks to enclose what the person said.

TENSE CHANGES

Future simple → Conditional simple

I will study He would study

Future continuous
Conditional continuous

I will be studying He would be studying

Can → Could May → Might

Must / have to → Had

Should/could/would/might/ought to/used to → No change

Be careful with personal pronouns and possessive adjectives and pronouns, they need to be changed according to the situation.

He told me, "I saw you last week".

He told me that he had seen me the previous week.

3. QUESTIONS

When we report questions, we don't follow the questions order. Instead, we use the word order of a statement. Here are the common verbs: ask, want to know, wonder, enquire, etc.

- 3.A. YES / NO QUESTIONS: When we report questions that can be answered by yes or no, we use a noun phrase beginning with if or whether (this must be used when we are asking someone to make a choice).
- "Are you happy here", he said He asked me if I was happy there.
- "Do you want coffee or tea", she asked me She asked me whether I wanted coffee or tea.

TIME CHANGES

DIRECT SPEECH → REPORTED SPEECH

The day after tomorrow—>in two days' time

Now → Then, that day

Today → that day

Yesterday → The day before, the previous day

Yesterday morning → The previous morning

Tomorrow → The next day, the following day

Tomorrow morning → The following morning

Next week → The following week, The next week

Last week → The previous week, The week before

Ago --> before

The day before yesterday → two days before

The day after tomorrow → in two days' time

+ If the reporting verb is in present, there is no change in tense verb:

He says, "I love pizza". He says that he loves pizza.

- + Be careful with conditional sentences, type 1 change, but type 2 and 3 don't change.
- 1. STATEMENTS: A common way of reporting someone's words is by using a noun clause beginning with that. However, we usually omit that, especially when the reporting verb is say or think.
- He said, "I can't go to the cinema"

He said that he couldn't go to the cinema.

- He told her," I bought you a present"

He told her that he had bought me a present.

- 2. COMMANDS AND REQUEST: When we report commands and request, we use the pattern: reporting verb + somebody to do something. Here are the common verbs: advise, ask, beg, command, order ,tell,
- He said, "Sit down here, please"

He told me to sit down there

- He asked me, "Don't smoke in my office" He asked me not to smoke in his office.
- 3.B.WH-QUESTIONS: When we report them, we use the wh-word, then we write the subject + the verb, ...
- He asked her, "Where have you been lately" He asked her where she had been lately.
- He wanted to know, "Who discovered America?" He wanted to know who had discovered America.
