

If clauses - Hier der Aufbau der einzelnen Typen:

### Type I: simple present – will-future

	simple present	will-future
If	we take a bus,	it will be cheaper.
	it doesn't rain,	we will go outside.
	they don't come soon,	she won't wait.

IF HE DOESN'T COME SOON,  
I WON'T WAIT.



### Type II: past tense – "would" + verb

	past tense	"would" + verb
If	we took the bus,	it would be cheaper.
	I were you,	I wouldn't do it.
	she didn't like me,	I would be very sad.

WHAT WOULD YOU SAY  
IF I BECAME A RAP STAR?



### Type III: past perfect – "would have done"

past perfect	"would have" + 3rd form
If I <b>had taken</b> the bus, it <b>would have been</b> cheaper.	

IF I HADN'T  
DRUNK SO MUCH,  
I WOULDN'T HAVE  
LOST MY JOB.

IF I HAD WORKED HARDER AT SCHOOL,  
MY LIFE WOULD HAVE BEEN DIFFERENT.
