

REPORTING VERBS

When reporting someone's words we usually move one tense further into the past. So *simple present* becomes *simple past*, *simple past* becomes *past perfect*, etc.

- [™] *"Jill <u>doesn't like</u> you."* ≻Paul told me that Jill didn't like me.
- [™] "I <u>saw</u> you at the airport yesterday." ≻Linda said that she had seen me at the airport the day before.
